Corresponding Secretary, Lucia Crenshaw, announced that Deborah Tipton made a donation to the Memphis Botanic Garden in honor of our board. Lucia is writing notes of condolence (or for any other reason) on behalf of LGC.

Lisa Snowden explained her new role in GCA. She is the Chairman of the Flower Design Committee. It is a new committee and quite an undertaking. She and her committee have redesigned By Design. It is available at no charge via email. They currently have four yearly workshops for design instructors and are working on two more. Hitomi Gilliam is coming to Memphis to do a workshop for the instructors February 26-28. Please volunteer to help if you are interested.

Linda Mallory announce that she and Leslie Schutt are doing a bulb-forcing workshop on January 16 at 10 a.m. at the MBG Hort Building. It is \$10 and limited to 20 people. Please email Linda or sign up at meeting if you want to attend.

Ragan Magness, Programs, is excited about tomorrow. Please be sure you have downloaded Snapseed. The workshop is \$15 if you are able to stay. Ryn Clark is the speaker and the program is "Flowers and Phones – an iPhone workshop.

Kate Connell, Travel co-chair, announced that the Garden Club of Nashville has extended an invitation of a flower tour to those of us (and our friends and family!) who are attending the Art and Antiques Show. We will meet at 8:45 Friday morning, February 1. GCN has also offered to reserve seats for us at the Faith Hill/Bobby McAlpine lecture at 11:00 am that morning. Seats will be released at 10:45, so get there early. Michelle Dunavant has reserved a block of rooms and there is one left at The Westin Hotel, Downtown Nashville. At this point, there are 20+ attending the flower tour and lecture.

For the ladies going to Greenville in April, payment of \$550 is due in full at the February meeting.

Sue Clark and Jean Johnston, Ways & Means, asked for honest feedback about this year's Christmas Greenery. We have not ordered from this company before (our former source is no longer selling the greenery). 33 members purchased greenery this year. We made \$633 profit after paying over \$800 in shipping. The general opinion of the group was that the greenery was dry when it arrived. Sue and Jean will look for something else to do next year. The Christmas Auction was very successful. We raised \$15,500. At tomorrow's membership meeting they will auction "Beer, Bocce and BBQ" (one item that was overlooked at the Christmas Auction). Kudos to Anne Keesee for starting the auction years ago to help raise the funds for our GCA travel expenses. This auction takes place every three years.

EJ suggested that Sue and Jean have aprons made to sell. A brief discussion ensued about what style aprons people preferred. We do need one with our new logo.

Mary Call called on Kathy Adams for new business. Kathy said that several past presidents have discussed a proposed bylaw change. Lisa Wilder, Parliamentarian, assisted with the explanation of the process of changing bylaws. We do not vote the month the changes are presented. We will vote at the March meeting.

LGC has invited Thomas Woltz to speak at the Joint Meeting. He was the keynote speaker at the GCA Annual Meeting in San Francisco this past year. Lisa Snowden said that he is the" rockstar" of the landscape design world. He is involved at Shelby Farms and we are hoping to involve him in downtown. The meeting and lunch will be at the Memphis Country Club.
