Garden History and Design


Bulb Augers! Do you have one?

They are a great tool to have in the shed and may put the shovel companies completely out of business. I've planted hundreds of tulip bulbs for the last three years and love how easy it makes that job. I have a 2", 3" and 6" currently for planting jobs of all sizes. From experience, I do NOT recommend using the augers with the long handles. If they hit a root or a rock they can really twist your wrist/elbow. Low and slow is better in this case. I recommend "Power Planter" or "Proven Winners" brands. Enjoy this 2 minute video!




